CAYCE, SC – Shaun Greenwood, Assistant City Manager of the [City of Cayce](#), recently received the Credentialed Manager designation from the [International City/County Management Association](#) (ICMA). Mr. Greenwood is just one of 23 ICMA Credentialed Managers in South Carolina, and one of 1,300 local government management professionals currently credentialed through the ICMA Voluntary Credentialing Program.

To receive the prestigious ICMA credential, a member must have significant experience as a senior management executive in local government; have earned a degree, preferably in public administration or a related field; and demonstrated a commitment to high standards of integrity and to lifelong learning and professional development. ICMA promotes excellence in local governance and increasing the proficiency of appointed chief administrative officers, assistant administrators, and other employees who serve local governments and regional entities around the world. The organization's nearly 9,000 members in 27 countries also include educators, students, and other local government employees.

The City of Cayce is the only local government in South Carolina that has a City Manager and an Assistant City Manager that are both ICMA Certified Managers.
