


City of Cayce Thanks Councilman for Years of Service

CAYCE, SC – Cayce City [Councilman Tim James](#), announced that he was taking a new position as Vice President/Director of Public Safety with the Ocean Reef Community Association in Florida. Councilman James made the announcement at the April 22nd City Council Meeting.

As a lifelong resident of Cayce, Councilman James has served as the City Councilman from District 4 for five years. Prior to that he served as the Police Chief for the City. He is currently the Executive Director of the [Lexington Medical Center Foundation](#). In addition to Councilman James years of service as a member of Cayce City Council and as the Cayce Police Chief, he has worked to honor veterans and public safety officials around the Midlands.
