CAYCE, SC – Elected officials, business leaders and employees from the [City of Cayce](#) will be planting a tree at Granby Park in honor of Arbor Day on **December 17, 2013 at 10:30 AM**. While Arbor Day in America is traditionally held in April, South Carolina has celebrated Arbor Day in December each year since 1934. Most states select their Arbor Day celebrations based on climate and their ideal season for planting.

Tomorrow, [Mayor Elise Partin and the members of the Cayce City Council](#) will read a Proclamation and plant a tree at Granby Park to emphasize the important role trees have in providing beautification, recreation and green spaces in the Cayce community.

The City of Cayce is also applying to be a [Tree City USA](#). The National Arbor Day Foundation recognizes more than 3,300 communities through the Tree City USA program. This national program honors cities and towns that are committed to planting and nurturing trees.
