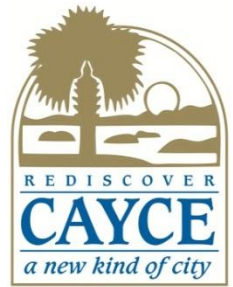


The City of Cayce Participates in 4th Annual Tartan Day South Festival
