



Cayce Historical Museum Announces Congaree Heritage Day of Unity

<u>CAYCE, SC</u> – The <u>City of Cayce</u> and the <u>Cayce Historical Museum</u> announce details for the Congaree Heritage Day of Unity.

The Congaree Heritage Day of Unity will be held Saturday, October 13th from 10 AM until 4 PM at the Cayce Historical Museum located at 1800 12th Street, behind Cayce City Hall. This free, family-friendly event will showcase Native American culture through dance, music, authentic craft demonstrations and storytelling. Also learn about primitive skills such as flint knapping, and pottery making. Experience the central role of dance in native culture as Native Americans perform a traditional "Candy Dance" for children.

In addition there will be reenactments from the Revolutionary War, the War Between the States, World War I and World War II. Cannons from the Revolutionary War and the War Between the States will be fired throughout the day. There will be free tours of the Cayce Historical Museum which has one of the largest collections of Native American artifacts in the South East, with nearly 8,000 arrowheads. A food vendor will be selling hamburgers, hot dogs and bar-b-q and there will also be a sno-cone vendor. The Local Boy Scouts, Troop 339, will be selling popcorn.
